**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 761 creates a new misdemeanor offense which could increase Office of Public Defender (OPD) caseload.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

**Assumptions:**

1. This bill creates a new misdemeanor offense that OPD's cases weight system would weight at 7 case weight hours.
2. OPD assumes cost per contract attorney hour will be \$71 due to FTE attorneys currently being at maximum caseload capacity.
3. OPD assumes the expense per new case created by this bill at 7 hours per case x \$71 per hour is \$497.
4. The total number of such new cases is unknown as this would be an entirely new offense for which OPD has no quantifiable data.
