Description of fiscal impact: SB 518 generally revises laws relating to parental rights regarding providing for parent involvement in education. SB 518 also increases by \$1 the fee for court filing fee for filings for interference with parental rights. This bill has an unknown fiscal impact to the state.

- The increased fee for civil actions brought under 40-6-701, MCA, will be remitted to the Department of Revenue (DOR) for deposit into the general fund.
