**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 885 revises public land access laws, revising lands that are eligible and providing an objection process for state land leaseholders.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

**Assumptions:**

- Under current law landowners are not eligible for a Public Access Land Agreement (PALA) if someone else is leasing the state land adjacent to their property.
- The Department of Fish Wildlife and Parks (FWP) is unable to estimate how many new agreements would be applied for with this change in statute.
