Description of fiscal impact: This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. HB 72 removes redundant language pertaining to gambling laws.
2. This bill clarifies how many restaurant beer and wine licenses with seating capacity of 101 or more are allowed in a quota area.
3. Under current law, 20% of the licensing fee must be submitted with a restaurant beer and wine license application. This bill removes this requirement and instead requires the license fee to be paid in full prior to the license being issued.
