BY REQUEST OF THE OFFICE OF BUDGET AND PROGRAM PLANNING

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR MAJOR REPAIR AND CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 2025; PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS; PROVIDING FOR A TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENTS LONG-RANGE BUILDING PROGRAM ACCOUNT TO THE MAJOR REPAIR LONG-RANGE BUILDING PROGRAM ACCOUNT AND FOR A TRANSFER OF FUNDS FROM THE STATE GENERAL FUND TO THE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENTS LONG-RANGE BUILDING PROGRAM ACCOUNT; AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF AN LRBP-ELIGIBLE BUILDING; PROVIDING FOR AN EMERGENCY SHELTER FACILITY INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT PROGRAM AND CRITERIA; PROVIDING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; AMENDING SECTION 17-7-201, MCA; AMENDING SECTION 1(4), CHAPTER 468, LAWS OF 2021; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Definitions.** As used in [sections 1 through 10], unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Authority only" means approval provided by the legislature to expend money that does not require an appropriation, including grants, donations, auxiliary funds, proprietary funds, nonstate funds, and university funds.
- (2) "Capital development" means capital projects provided for in 17-7-201(2).
- (3) "Capital project" means the planning, design, renovation, construction, alteration, replacement, furnishing, repair, improvement, site, utility, or land acquisition project provided for in [sections 1 through 10].
- (4) "LRBP capital development" means the long-range building program capital developments account in the capital projects fund type provided for in 17-7-209.
- (5) "LRBP major repair" or "LRBP MR" means the long-range building program major repair

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1 account in the capital projects fund type provided for in 17-7-221.

2 (6) "Major repair" means capital projects provided for in 17-7-201(7).

3 (7) "Other funding sources" means money other than LRBP money, state special revenue, or
4 federal special revenue that accrues to an agency under the provisions of law.

5 (8) "SBCEP" means funds from the state building energy conservation program account in the
6 capital projects fund type, which may be utilized on either or both major repair and capital development
7 projects.

9 **NEW SECTION. Section 2. Major repair projects appropriations and authorizations.** (1) The
10 following money is appropriated to the department of administration for the indicated major repair projects from
11 the indicated sources. Funds not requiring legislative appropriation are included for the purpose of
12 authorization. The department of administration is authorized to adjust capital project amounts within the
13 legislative intent of the major repair account-funded projects, subject to available revenues, if approved by the
14 office of budget and program planning, and transfer the appropriations, authority, or both among the necessary
15 fund types for these projects:

NEW SECTION. Section 6. Planning and design. The department of administration may proceed with the planning and design of capital projects in either or both [sections 2 and 3] prior to the receipt of other funding sources. The department may use interentity loans in accordance with 17-2-107 to pay planning and design costs incurred before the receipt of other funding sources.

NEW SECTION. Section 7. Capital projects -- contingent funds. (1) If a capital project is financed, in whole or in part, with appropriations contingent upon the receipt of other funding sources, the department of administration may not let the project for bid until a financial plan and agreement with the agency has been approved by the director of the department of administration. A financial plan and agreement may not be approved by the director if:

- (a) the level of funding and authorization provided under the financial plan and agreement deviates substantially from the funding level provided in either or both [sections 2 and 3] for that project; or
 - (b) the scope of the project is substantially altered or revised from the concept and intent for that project as presented to the 68th legislature.
- (2) This section does not limit or restrict 17-7-211.

NEW SECTION. Section 8. Review by department of environmental quality. The department of environmental quality shall review capital projects authorized in either or both [sections 2 and 3] for potential inclusion in the state building energy conservation program (SBECP) under Title 90, chapter 4, part 6. When a review shows that a capital project will result in energy or utility savings and improvements, that project must be submitted to the energy conservation program for funding consideration by the SBECP. Funding provided under the energy conservation program guidelines must be used to offset or add to the authorized funding for the project, and the amount will be dependent on the annual utility savings resulting from the capital project. Agencies must be notified of potential funding after the review and are obligated to utilize the SBECP funding, if available.

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NEW SECTION. **Section 9. Legislative consent.** The appropriations authorized in [sections 1 through 8] constitute legislative consent for the capital projects contained in [sections 1 through 8] within the meaning of 18-2-102.

NEW SECTION. **Section 10. Increase in state funding for program expansion or operations and maintenance.** If an immediate or future increase in state funding for program expansion or operations and maintenance is required for a new facility in [section 3] but the increase is not appropriated by the 68th legislature, the new facility in [section 3] is not appropriated or authorized as provided in 17-7-210.

NEW SECTION. **Section 11. Transfer of funds.** By August 15, 2023, the department of administration shall make the following transfers:

- (1) \$41,420,091 from the capital developments long-range building program account established in 17-7-209 to the major repair long-range building program account established in 17-7-221.
- (2) \$113,000,000 from the general fund to the capital developments long-range building program account established in 17-7-209.

Section 12. Section 17-7-201, MCA, is amended to read:

"17-7-201. Definitions. In this part, the following definitions apply:

- (1) (a) "Building" includes a:
 - (i) building, facility, or structure constructed or purchased wholly or in part with state money;
 - (ii) building, facility, or structure at a state institution;
 - (iii) building, facility, or structure owned or to be owned by a state agency, including the department of transportation.
- (b) The term does not include a:
 - (i) building, facility, or structure owned or to be owned by a county, city, town, school district, or special improvement district;
 - (ii) facility or structure used as a component part of a highway or water conservation project.

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1 (2) "Capital development" means a:

2 (a) renovation, construction, alteration, site, or utility project with a total cost of \$2.5 million or

3 more;

4 (b) new facility with a construction cost of \$250,000 or more; or

5 (c) purchase of real property for which an appropriation is required to fund the purchase.

6 (3) "Construction" includes construction, repair, alteration, renovation, and equipping and

7 furnishing during construction, repair, or alteration.

8 (4) "Division" means the architecture and engineering division of the department of administration.

9 (5) "High-performance building" means a building that integrates and optimizes all major high-

10 performance building attributes, including but not limited to:

11 (a) energy efficiency;

12 (b) durability;

13 (c) life-cycle performance; and

14 (d) occupant productivity.

15 (6) (a) "Long-range building program-eligible building" means a building, facility, or structure

16 eligible for major repair account funding that:

17 (i) is owned or fully operated by a state agency and for which the operation and maintenance are

18 funded with state general fund money; or

19 (ii) ~~that~~ supports academic missions of the university system and for which the operation and

20 maintenance are funded with current unrestricted university funds.

21 (b) The term does not include a building, facility, or structure:

22 (i) owned or operated by a state agency and for which the operation and maintenance are entirely

23 funded with state special revenue, federal special revenue, or proprietary funds; or

24 (ii) that supports nonacademic functions of the university system and for which the operation and

25 maintenance are funded from nonstate and nontuition sources.

26 (7) (a) "Major repair" means:

27 (i) a renovation, alteration, replacement, or repair project with a total cost of less than \$2.5 million;

28 (ii) a site or utility improvement with a total cost of less than \$2.5 million; or

1 (iii) a new facility with a total construction cost of less than \$250,000.

2 (b) The term does not include operations and maintenance as defined in this section.

3 (8) (a) "New facility" means the construction of a new building on state property regardless of
4 funding source and includes:

5 (i) an addition to an existing building; and

6 (ii) the enclosure of space that was not previously fully enclosed.

7 (b) The term does not include the replacement of state-owned space that is demolished or that is
8 otherwise removed from state use if the total construction cost of the replacement space is less than \$2.5
9 million.

10 (9) "Operations and maintenance" means operational costs and regular, ongoing, and routine
11 repairs and maintenance funded in an agency operating budget that does not extend the capacity, function, or
12 lifespan of a facility.

13 (10) "Replacement cost of existing long-range building program-eligible building" means the current
14 replacement value of all long-range building program-eligible buildings included in the statewide facility
15 inventory and condition assessment as provided in 17-7-202."

16
17 **NEW SECTION. Section 13. Project management and supervision.** Up to \$2,000,000 is
18 appropriated from the major repair long-range building program account to the architecture and engineering
19 division for the purposes of contracted services or modified positions, and associated operating expenses, to
20 expeditiously implement [sections 1 through 9]. The division is authorized to transfer the appropriation among
21 the necessary fund types for supervision and project management.

22
23 **NEW SECTION. Section 14. Definitions.** For the purposes of [sections 14 through 20], unless
24 otherwise provided, the following definitions apply:

25 (1) "Emergency shelter" means any facility, the primary purpose of which is to provide a temporary
26 shelter for the homeless in general or for specific populations of the homeless and which does not require
27 occupants to sign leases or occupancy agreements.

28 (2) "Nonprofit corporation" means a domestic corporation, as designated in accordance with 35-2-

1 126, that provides emergency shelter for the homeless.

2

3 **NEW SECTION. Section 15. Emergency shelter facility infrastructure account -- use.** (1) There is
4 within the state special revenue fund provided for in 17-2-102 an account called the emergency shelter facility
5 infrastructure account to provide grant funding to nonprofit corporations that provide emergency shelter for the
6 homeless and for administrative costs related to administering the grants. The department of commerce shall
7 administer the account.

8 (2) Up to 3% of the funds appropriated in [section 21] may be allocated for the department's
9 administrative costs.

10

11 **NEW SECTION. Section 16. Emergency shelter facility infrastructure grants authorization.** (1)
12 The department of commerce is authorized to make up to \$5 million in grants to nonprofit corporations for
13 emergency shelter, property acquisition, construction, shelter space acquisition, or general capital improvement
14 projects. The grants authorized in this section are subject to the conditions set forth in [section 18].

15 (2) The department of commerce must receive proposals from nonprofit corporations for
16 emergency shelter facility infrastructure projects.

17 (3) Funding for projects may be provided only as long as there are sufficient funds available from
18 the amount that was deposited or transferred into the emergency shelter facility infrastructure account for
19 grants established in [section 15(1)]. Funding for these projects must be made available in the order that the
20 grant recipients satisfy the conditions described in [section 18].

21

22 **NEW SECTION. Section 17. Eligibility -- submission deadline -- priority -- rulemaking authority.**

23 (1) A nonprofit corporation may apply to the department of commerce for emergency shelter facility
24 infrastructure grants under [section 16].

25 (2) Nonprofit corporations shall submit grant applications to the department in order to be eligible
26 for funding under [section 16].

27 (3) The department is authorized to adopt rules or guidelines necessary to implement [sections 14
28 through section 20].

1

2 **NEW SECTION. Section 18. Condition of grants -- disbursement of funds.** (1) The disbursement

3 of grant funds for the projects chosen by the department of commerce pursuant to [section 16] is subject to

4 completion of the following conditions:

5 (a) For grants in an amount of \$25,000 or more, the grant recipient shall document the availability
6 of matching funds or in-kind contributions of assets with an appraised value from private sources representing
7 at least \$1 in value for each \$1 of the grant.

8 (b) The grant recipient shall execute a grant agreement with the department of commerce that
9 includes a project management plan and reporting requirements to track the outcomes of allocated grants.

10 (c) The grant recipient shall satisfy other specific requirements considered necessary by the
11 department of commerce to accomplish the purpose of the project as evidenced by the application to the
12 department.

13 (2) Projects must adhere to the design standards required by applicable regulatory agencies.
14 Recipients of program funds for projects that are not subject to any design standards must comply with
15 generally accepted industry standards.

16 (3) If actual project expenses are lower than the projected expense of the project, the department
17 shall reduce the amount of grant funds to be provided to grant recipients.

18

19 **NEW SECTION. Section 19. Maximum state funding available -- per project -- per county.** (1)

20 The maximum amount of state funding allocated to entities within any individual county under [sections 14
21 through 18] may not exceed \$750,000.

22 (2) If total applications within a specific jurisdiction exceed the maximum amount allowed, the
23 department shall include input from local elected officials in their ranking criteria for those applications.

24

25 **NEW SECTION. Section 20. Transfer of funds.** By July 1, 2023, the state treasurer shall transfer \$5
26 million from the general fund to the emergency shelter facility infrastructure account established in [section 15].

27

28 **NEW SECTION. Section 21. Appropriation.** There is appropriated \$5 million for the biennium

1 beginning July 1, 2023, from the emergency shelter facility infrastructure account established in [section 15] to
2 the department of commerce for grants as authorized in [sections 14 through 19].

3
4 **NEW SECTION. Section 22. Severability.** If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are
5 severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications,
6 the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.

7
8 **Section 23.** Section 1, Chapter 468, Laws of 2021, is amended to read:

9 **Section 1. Authorizations of and appropriations for capital projects.** The portion of section
10 1(4)(c), Chapter 468, Laws of 2021, appropriating money from the general fund to the Montana university
11 system for program expansion or operations and maintenance for the indicated new facility is amended to read:

16 **NEW SECTION. Section 24. Effective date.** [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
