6 (3) Funding for the projects in subsection (2) is provided in the order of priority as long as there are  
7 sufficient funds available from the amount that was deposited in the historic preservation grant program account  
8 during the biennium beginning July 1, 2025. The funds in this subsection (3) must be awarded for the projects  
9 and in amounts not to exceed the amounts set out in subsection (2) subject to the conditions set forth in  
10 [section 3]. However, any of the projects listed in subsection (2) that do not complete the conditions described  
11 in [section 3(1)] by September 1, 2026, must be reviewed by the next regular legislature to determine if the  
12 authorized grant should be withdrawn.

13 (4) If sufficient funds are available, this section constitutes a valid obligation of funds to the grant  
14 projects listed in subsection (2) for the purposes of encumbering the funds in the historic preservation grant  
15 program account established in 22-3-1307 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, pursuant to 17-7-302. A  
16 grant recipient's entitlement to receive funds is dependent on the grant recipient's compliance with the  
17 conditions described in [section 3] and on the availability of funds.

18 (5) The legislature, pursuant to 22-3-1305, authorizes the grants for the projects specified in  
19 subsection (2).

20 (6) (a) Except as provided in subsection (6)(b), a grant recipient shall enter into a definitive, binding  
21 contract with a qualified contractor to construct the project prior to September 30 of the even-numbered year  
22 preceding the next regularly scheduled legislative session. If the grant recipient fails to meet the deadline, any  
23 obligation to the grant recipient ceases, and the funds revert to the historic preservation grant program account  
24 established in 22-3-1307 for use in the next biennium.

25 (b) A grant recipient who fails to meet the contract deadline for either of the following reasons may  
26 request one 2-year extension, during which the project must be placed under contract or any obligation to the  
27 grant ceases:

28 (i) the project is damaged by fire or another form of casualty; or

1 (ii) the grant recipient fails to find a qualified contractor to construct the project and diligently  
2 pursued all reasonable avenues to find a qualified contractor.

3 (7) Grant recipients shall complete all of the conditions described in [section 3(1)] by September  
4 30, 2026, or any obligation to the grant recipient ceases.

5  
6 **NEW SECTION. Section 2. Approval of grants -- completion of biennial appropriation.** (1) The  
7 legislature, pursuant to 22-3-1305, authorizes grants for the projects specified in [section 1(2)].

8 (2) The authorization of these grants completes a biennial appropriation from the historic  
9 preservation grant program account established in 22-3-1307.

10 (3) Grants to entities from prior biennia are reauthorized for the completion of contract work.

11  
12 **NEW SECTION. Section 3. Condition of grants -- disbursement of funds.** (1) The disbursement of  
13 grant funds for the projects specified in [section 1(2)] is subject to the completion of the following conditions:

14 (a) The grant recipient shall document that other matching funds required for the completion of the  
15 project are firmly committed.

16 (b) The grant recipient must have a project management plan that is approved by the department  
17 of commerce.

18 (c) The grant recipient must be in compliance with the auditing and reporting requirements  
19 provided for in 2-7-503 and establish a financial accounting system that the department can reasonably ensure  
20 conforms to generally accepted accounting principles. Tribal governments shall comply with the auditing and  
21 reporting requirements provided for in 2 CFR 200.

22 (d) The grant recipient shall satisfactorily comply with any conditions described in the application or  
23 project summaries section of the Montana historic preservation grant program 2025 biennium report to the 69th  
24 legislature.

25 (e) The grant recipient shall satisfy other specific requirements considered necessary by the  
26 department of commerce to accomplish the purpose of the project as evidenced by the application to the  
27 department.

28 (f) The grant recipient shall execute a grant agreement with the department of commerce.
