**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 40 establishes information sharing with state agency for the purpose of conducting reviews of fetal, infant, child, and maternal mortality cases for statewide trend or pattern analysis. This bill also adds language to allow the Director of the Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS), as needed, to establish a state fetal, infant, child, and maternal mortality review team. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

**Assumptions:**

1. HB 40 does not require DPHHS to create a fetal, infant, child and maternal mortality review team or to have a standing team appointed. With no directive of a standing team, the agency does not forecast a fiscal impact at this time.
2. The Department of Justice anticipates any additional requirement of the bill will be covered with existing resources.
