Description of fiscal impact: HB 107 aligns the responsibilities of the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) and local jurisdictions with federal law. This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. The Department of Military Affairs (DMA) follows federal law. HB 107 coordinates 10-3-103, MCA, with existing federal law that are already established and followed.
2. The Department of Health and Human Services (DPHHS), the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and the Department of Transportation (MDT) are already appointed members of the SERC and would not take on any additional duties or costs as a result of this bill.

Local Government Impacts:

1. Montana Association of Counties (MACO) indicates that the bill provides a list of existing federal requirements for local hazardous response plans. The bill does not create any additional requirements for local governments. MACO indicates that the cost for a county to update a plan is about \$15,000.
