3 BY REQUEST OF THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

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 5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LAWS RELATING TO
 6 CATERING ENDORSEMENTS; ALLOWING BEER AND WINE LICENSEES TO OBTAIN A CATERING
 7 ENDORSEMENT WITHOUT HAVING TO BE ENGAGED PRIMARILY IN THE BUSINESS OF PROVIDING
 8 MEALS; PROVIDING THAT CONCESSIONAIRES MAY NOT SPONSOR CATERED EVENTS; AMENDING
 9 SECTIONS 16-4-111 AND 16-4-204, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

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 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

 13 **Section 1.** Section 16-4-111, MCA, is amended to read:

14 **"16-4-111. Catering endorsement for beer and wine licensees.** (1) (a) A person who is engaged
 15 ~~primarily in the business of providing meals with table service and who is licensed to sell beer at retail or beer~~
 16 and wine at retail for on-premises consumption may, ~~upon~~on the approval of the department, be granted a
 17 catering endorsement to the license to allow the catering and sale of beer or beer and wine to persons
 18 attending a special event ~~upon~~on premises not otherwise licensed for the sale of beer or beer and wine for on-
 19 premises consumption. The beer or wine must be consumed on the premises where the event is held.

20 (b) A person who is licensed pursuant to 16-4-420 to sell beer at retail or beer and wine at retail for
 21 on-premises consumption may, ~~upon~~on the approval of the department, be granted a catering endorsement to
 22 the license to allow the catering and sale of beer and wine to persons attending a special event ~~upon~~on
 23 premises not otherwise licensed for the sale of beer or beer and wine, along with food equal in cost to 65% of
 24 the total gross revenue from the catering contract, for on-premises consumption. The beer or wine must be
 25 consumed on the premises where the event is held.

26 (2) ~~A written~~ An application for a catering endorsement and an annual fee of \$200 must be
 27 submitted to the department for its approval.

28 (3) A licensee who holds a catering endorsement may not cater an event in which the licensee or

1 the concessionaire of the licensee is the sponsor. The catered event must be within 100 miles of the licensee's
 2 regular place of business licensed premises measured in a straight line from the nearest entrance of the
 3 licensed premises to the nearest boundary of the catered event.

4 (4) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (8), THE STORAGE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY OCCUR ON
 5 THE PREMISES OF THE CATERED EVENT 1 DAY PRIOR TO THE CATERED EVENT UNTIL 1 DAY FOLLOWING THE
 6 CONCLUSION OF THE CATERED EVENT IF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE IN A SECURED LOCATION THAT PREVENTS
 7 ACCESS BY ANYONE OTHER THAN THE LICENSEE OR THE LICENSEE'S EMPLOYEES.

8 ~~(4)(5)~~ The licensee shall notify the local law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over the
 9 premises that the catered event is to be held. A LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY CHARGE A fee of \$35 ~~must accompany~~
 10 ~~the notice.~~

11 ~~(5)(6)~~ The sale of beer or beer and wine pursuant to a catering endorsement is subject to the
 12 provisions of 16-6-103.

13 ~~(6)(7)~~ The sale of beer or beer and wine pursuant to a catering endorsement is subject to the
 14 provisions of 16-3-306, unless entities named in 16-3-306 give their written approval for the on-premises sale of
 15 beer or beer and wine on premises where the event is to be held.

16 ~~(7) (a) A catering endorsement issued for the purpose of selling and serving beer or beer and wine~~
 17 ~~at a special event conducted on the premises of a county fairground or public sports arena authorizes the~~
 18 ~~licensee to sell and serve beer or beer and wine in the grandstand and bleacher area of the premises, as well~~
 19 ~~as from a booth, stand, or other fixed place on the premises.~~

20 ~~(b) A catering endorsement issued for the purpose of selling and serving beer or beer and wine at~~
 21 ~~a sporting event conducted on the premises of a Montana university as provided in 16-4-112 authorizes the~~
 22 ~~licensee to sell and serve beer or beer and wine in the grandstand and bleacher area of the premises, as well~~
 23 ~~as from a booth, stand, or other fixed place on the premises.~~

24 (8) A LICENSEE MAY SELL AND SERVE BEER AND WINE IN THE GRANDSTANDS AND BLEACHER AREA OF THE
 25 PREMISES, AS WELL AS FROM A BOOTH, STAND, OR OTHER FIXED PLACED ON THE PREMISES WHEN THE CATERED EVENT
 26 IS HELD ON THE PREMISES OF A COUNTY FAIRGROUND, PUBLIC SPORTS ARENA, OR MONTANA UNIVERSITY AS DEFINED IN
 27 16-4-112. IF THE LICENSEE HAS A WRITTEN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF MONTANA, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF
 28 THE STATE, OR A MONTANA UNIVERSITY TO SELL AND SERVE BEER AND WINE FOR MULTIPLE CATERED EVENTS AT THE

1 PREMISES, THE LICENSEE MAY STORE BEER AND WINE TO BE USED FOR THE CATERED EVENTS ON THE PREMISES OF THE
 2 FAIRGROUND, PUBLIC SPORTS ARENA, OR MONTANA UNIVERSITY FOR THE LENGTH OF THE WRITTEN AGREEMENT IF THE
 3 BEER AND WINE CAN BE STORED IN A SECURE LOCATION THAT PREVENTS ACCESS BY ANYONE OTHER THAN THE
 4 LICENSEE OR THE LICENSEE'S EMPLOYEES. EACH CATERED EVENT HELD AT THE PREMISES IS SUBJECT TO THE
 5 REQUIREMENT IN SUBSECTION (5) AND MUST BE INDIVIDUALLY REPORTED TO THE DEPARTMENT.

6 ~~(8)~~(9) A licensee may not share revenue from the sale of alcoholic beverages with the sponsor of the
 7 catered event unless the sponsor is the state of Montana, a political subdivision of the state, a Montana
 8 university as provided in 16-4-112, or a qualified entity under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26
 9 U.S.C. 501(c), as amended."

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11 **Section 2.** Section 16-4-204, MCA, is amended to read:

12 **"16-4-204. Transfer -- catering endorsement for all-beverages licensees -- competitive bidding -**

13 **- rulemaking.** (1) (a) Except as provided in subsection (3), a license may be transferred to a new owner and to
 14 a location outside the quota area where the license is currently located only when the following criteria are met:

15 (i) the total number of all-beverages licenses in the current quota area exceeded the quota for that
 16 area by at least 25% in the most recent census prescribed in 16-4-502;

17 (ii) the total number of all-beverages licenses in the quota area to which the license would be
 18 transferred, exclusive of those issued under 16-4-209(1)(a) and (1)(b), did not exceed that area's quota in the
 19 most recent census prescribed in 16-4-502:

20 (A) by more than 33%; or

21 (B) in an incorporated city of more than 10,000 inhabitants and within 5 miles of its corporate limits,
 22 by more than 43%; ~~or~~ and

23 (iii) the department finds, after a public hearing, that the public convenience and necessity would
 24 be served by a transfer.

25 (b) A license transferred pursuant to subsection (1)(a) that was issued pursuant to a competitive
 26 bidding process is not eligible to offer gambling under Title 23, chapter 5, part 3, 5, or 6.

27 (2) When the department determines that a license may be transferred from one quota area to
 28 another under subsection (1), the department shall use a competitive bidding process as provided in 16-4-430

1 to determine the party afforded the opportunity to purchase and transfer a license.

2 (3) A license within an incorporated quota area may be transferred to a new owner and to a new
3 unincorporated location within the same county on application to and with consent of the department when the
4 total number of all-beverages licenses in the current quota area, exclusive of those issued under 16-4-209(1)(a)
5 and (1)(b), exceeds the quota for that area by at least 25% in the most recent census and will not fall below that
6 level because of the transfer.

7 (4) A license issued under 16-4-209(1)(a) may not be transferred to a location outside the quota
8 area and the exterior boundaries of the Montana Indian reservation for which it was originally issued.

9 (5) (a) Any all-beverages licensee is, ~~upon~~on the approval and in the discretion of the department,
10 entitled to a catering endorsement to the licensee's all-beverages license to allow the catering and sale of
11 alcoholic beverages to persons attending a special event on premises not otherwise licensed for the sale of
12 alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption. The alcoholic beverages must be consumed on the
13 premises where the event is held.

14 (b) ~~A written~~ An application for a catering endorsement and an annual fee of \$250 must be
15 submitted to the department for its approval.

16 (c) An all-beverages licensee who holds ~~an endorsement granted under this subsection (5) a~~
17 catering endorsement may not cater an event in which the licensee or the concessionaire of the licensee is the
18 sponsor. The catered event must be within 100 miles of the licensee's ~~regular place of business~~ licensed
19 premises measured in a straight line from the nearest entrance of the licensed premises to the nearest
20 boundary of the catered event.

21 (D) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (5)(H), THE STORAGE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES MAY OCCUR
22 ON THE PREMISES OF THE CATERED EVENT 1 DAY PRIOR TO THE CATERED EVENT UNTIL 1 DAY FOLLOWING THE
23 CONCLUSION OF THE CATERED EVENT IF THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE IN A SECURED LOCATION THAT PREVENTS
24 ACCESS BY ANYONE OTHER THAN THE LICENSEE OR THE LICENSEE'S EMPLOYEES.

25 ~~(d)(E)~~ The licensee shall notify the local law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over the
26 premises where the catered event is to be held. A LOCAL GOVERNMENT MAY CHARGE A fee of \$35 ~~must~~
27 ~~accompany the notice.~~

28 ~~(e)(F)~~ The sale of alcoholic beverages pursuant to a catering endorsement is subject to the provisions

1 of 16-6-103.

2 ~~(f)(g)~~ The sale of alcoholic beverages pursuant to a catering endorsement is subject to the provisions
3 of 16-3-306, unless entities named in 16-3-306 give their written approval.

4 ~~(g)~~ — A catering endorsement issued for the purpose of selling and serving beer and wine at a
5 special event conducted on the premises of a county fairground or public sports arena authorizes the licensee
6 to sell and serve beer and wine in the grandstand and bleacher area of the premises, as well as from a booth,
7 stand, or other fixed place on the premises.

8 ~~(h)~~ — A catering endorsement issued for the purpose of selling and serving liquor or beer and wine at
9 a sporting event conducted on the premises of a Montana university as provided in 16-4-112 authorizes the
10 licensee to sell and serve liquor or beer and wine in the grandstand and bleacher area of the premises, as well
11 as from a booth, stand, or other fixed place on the premises.

12 (H) A LICENSEE MAY SELL AND SERVE LIQUOR, BEER, AND WINE IN THE GRANDSTANDS AND BLEACHER
13 AREA OF THE PREMISES, AS WELL AS FROM A BOOTH, STAND, OR OTHER FIXED PLACED ON THE PREMISES WHEN THE
14 CATERED EVENT IS HELD ON THE PREMISES OF A COUNTY FAIRGROUND, PUBLIC SPORTS ARENA, OR MONTANA
15 UNIVERSITY AS DEFINED IN 16-4-112. IF THE LICENSEE HAS A WRITTEN AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF MONTANA, A
16 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, OR A MONTANA UNIVERSITY TO SELL AND SERVE LIQUOR, BEER, AND WINE FOR
17 MULTIPLE CATERED EVENTS AT THE PREMISES, THE LICENSEE MAY STORE LIQUOR, BEER, AND WINE TO BE USED FOR
18 THE CATERED EVENTS ON THE PREMISES OF THE FAIRGROUND, PUBLIC SPORTS ARENA, OR MONTANA UNIVERSITY FOR
19 THE LENGTH OF THE WRITTEN AGREEMENT IF THE LIQUOR, BEER, AND WINE CAN BE STORED IN A SECURE LOCATION THAT
20 PREVENTS ACCESS BY ANYONE OTHER THAN THE LICENSEE OR THE LICENSEE'S EMPLOYEES. EACH CATERED EVENT
21 HELD AT THE PREMISES IS SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENT IN SUBSECTION (5)(E) AND MUST BE INDIVIDUALLY REPORTED
22 TO THE DEPARTMENT.

23 (i) A licensee may not share revenue from the sale of alcoholic beverages with the sponsor of the
24 catered event unless the sponsor is the state of Montana, a political subdivision of the state, a Montana
25 university as provided in 16-4-112, or a qualified entity under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, 26
26 U.S.C. 501(c), as amended.

27 (6) The department may adopt rules to implement this section."
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
