Description of fiscal impact: This bill has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. A primary victim that meets the detailed criteria for the compensation may be reimbursed up to a total of \$25,000 for specific types of expenses caused by the criminal act.
2. A homicide victim is considered a primary victim. Currently, any funeral or burial expenses for that victim are capped at the amount of \$3,500 of the total \$25,000.
3. HB 183 raises the cap from \$3,500 to \$10,000 that may be used for funeral expenses still within the \$25,000 total. No additional funds are required as a result of this bill.
