**Description of fiscal impact:** SB 198, as amended, will establish certification, credentialing as well as certification and credentialing requirements for Behavioral Health Peer Support Specialists, and Behavioral Health Peer Support Specialist Candidates, allows rulemaking to specify education, experience, and supervised experience requirements, for credentialed candidates and credentials. This bill has no fiscal impact for the state.
