Description of fiscal impact: HB 279 has no fiscal impact to the state.

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

1. HB 279, as amended, requires the Department of Revenue to certify two different types of responsible server and sales training programs including one for employees of on-premises consumption licensees and one for employees of off-premises consumption licensees.
2. This bill requires on-premises training programs to be at least two hours long and for off-premises training programs to be at least one hour long.
3. The amendments in this bill clarify that certifications expire after three years.
4. This bill requires the Department of Revenue Alcoholic Beverage Control Division (ABCD) to rework its training program and would require the approved training providers to update their programs.
5. ABCD can update its training program with existing staff.
6. Updates to the department's server portal are also needed to capture server training information required in this bill.
7. The changes required for this bill would create no additional cost to the Department of Revenue.

Technical Notes:

1. The effective date of July 1, 2023 poses a timing issue for providers to be notified of the changes, update their training programs, and obtain approval by the Department of Revenue prior to this date.
2. A later effective date of January 1, 2024 may provide a better opportunity for training providers to come into compliance with the bill requirements and be approved by the Department of Revenue.
