**Description of fiscal impact:** HB 304, as amended, has no fiscal impact to the state.

### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### Assumptions:

#### **Department of Revenue**

1. HB 304, as amended in the Senate State Administration committee, requires all indoor marijuana manufacturing and cultivation premises located within a mile of another business or residence to have an air filtration system for the reduction of marijuana odor at the exterior of the building.
2. The Department of Revenue would have to inspect these air filtration systems during their regular inspection process and may grant three-month extensions to licensees in order to come into compliance and install an air filtration system. The department may also conduct more than two unannounced inspections during the year.
3. The amendment removes the requirement for the Department of Revenue to make specific inspections to objectively measure the odors present at the boundary of the property, so the department would not need to purchase nasal rangers or add additional FTE.
4. As amended, this bill has no fiscal impact to the Department of Revenue.
